# God is Working

REPORT FROM THE JOURNEY LEADERSHIP COMMUNITY

The final question of the May 23<sup>rd</sup> meeting of the JLC: "What is the headline for this meeting?" Answer: GOD IS WORKING! The Journey Leadership Community met on May 23<sup>rd</sup>. Attending: Lena Taylor, Joe Kendrick, Elizabeth Dean, Mary Dunston, Phyllis Johnson, Cynthia May, James Lynn, Davin Smith, Gerry Robinson, and Pastor. Mitzi Gentry had a schedule conflict and Cecelia Fleet was on vacation in Nags Head.

Following a delicious BBQ meal with all the trimmings (including gluten free BBQ for Mary) we moved to the den for a time of "being." We read from the genealogies in Matthew listened to a song sung by Lacy Kendrick in a recent worship service. Hebrews 11 was read, highlighting "Defining Moments" in the lives of our biblical ancestors. We noted the life of King David, both positive (Goliath) and negative (Bathsheba). We also spoke of Defining Moments in the history of Hatcher, positive and negative. An overarching question for the meeting was "How will the JLC (and other leaders) participate as we approach Defining Moments in our present situation in history and in Lakeside? How will we be the PRESENCE OF JESUS CHRIST?"

Following the being time, two specific questions were presented:

## 1) Agree or Disagree: God has been in this process called Pursuing Missional Faithfulness in positive ways.

Summarized responses as follows:

- Yes. For me, God has been in this because we see what we are looking for. I am looking for how God is working.
- Yes. Definitely.
- Agree. Especially there have been aha moments when I have thought about something in a new way. I have sensed enthusiasm, especially as we have kept the discussion God-centered.
- God has been in this for THIS group but I am not sure that's true for the congregation. Maybe it's something we have to live and not just hear about. We knew it was a journey and not a destination.

- It is a positive thing for me. But maybe it's a scary moment too as we realize that we have to approach things in a different way.
- Absolutely. God is on it, over it, and through it. I don't know that any of us knows what that means + how God will lead from here.
- Every time we've been on retreats and together in meetings we could feel the Spirit. But the mystery that's out there is not something we're comfortable with. And it's not easy to communicate with others.
- God has been present in PMF, especially in the triplet meetings and the first two retreats. Less so in the clusters and last retreat.
- YES. I see God at work in everything we are doing. We truly do see what we are looking for. In the bulb there's the flower; in the cocoon there's a butterfly.
- I have to grow. It's MY job to grow, to search, and to listen. I can't be responsible for how others grow but I am for me.

## 2) What should the JLC do from here?

- Be positive. Each of us should remain positive.
- Get the church more involved. We should do that individually.
- Continue our monthly meetings. Next meeting will be at Mary Dunston's house on June 27 at 6pm.
- Prayer: create a list of weekly Prayer Focus items and share those with the church. (Pastor will work with James, Liz, and Cecelia to make that happen in the near future.)

A final question was posed: What is the headline from tonight's meeting? GOD IS WORKING!

## My Journey with God's Book—Part Three of Four or more—Looking for the pony!

*Below is a continuation of "My Journey with God's Book." Our Baptist heritage teaches that the bible must be read and loved through our relationship with Jesus Christ. "As we walk with the Lord in the Light of His Word, what a glory He sheds on our way!"*

In July 1988, we were graduated Master of Divinity (cum laude and *thank you, Lawdy!*) from *Southwestern Baptist Seminary* in Texas. I was 34, Cindy 33; our sons were 10 and 9 and had only known a "buried in books" dad balanced by a loving and wonderful Christian mom. Early that spring, I mailed dozens of resumes all over the country. We were singing "*Wherever he leads we'll go.*"

In April, we received a phone call from Dr. Michael Curry, Senior Pastor at Fairmount Memorial Baptist Church in Richmond. They were looking for an associate who would focus in the areas of discipleship and evangelism. Also on the phone with Dr. Curry was Personnel Chair, Cecil Custalow (from of the Mattaponi Indian Tribe.) His deep slow drawl was certifiably "Virginian."

I cannot adequately convey our excitement. We were quietly ecstatic. This was God fulfilling his promises, a ringing affirmation that God was indeed working! A weekend visit was planned; plane tickets were sent. Cindy and I would be flying to Richmond for a weekend "in view of a call." Did I say, "At the church's expense!" Our friends at seminary joined us in celebration and anticipation of God's "call." Yet, some cautioned.

The weekend in Richmond was clockwork. We presented our "best." We were a young, attractive family committed to Jesus Christ. And, we were ready and willing to serve. Plus, when Cindy opened her mouth to sing, the angels "hushed their singing." I remember her song that morning: "People need the Lord." Indeed. We returned to Fort Worth "on top of the world." Throughout the whole experience there was not a single glitch.

We were told the process from there would be routine. The church would conduct a church business meeting in which the Personnel Committee would recommend our call. There would be a vote, an invitation extended, and we would reply a resounding YES. Then, we would pack our few things and move to Richmond immediately after graduation in July. The heavens were opening. We were "standing on the promises." Yet, some cautioned.

Each day of the following week we waited by a silent phone. Six years. We had been waiting six years on a call like that. Still, no call. Surely the phone number's been lost. Into the second week, I left a message at the pastor's house, to no avail. Two full weeks

later the phone finally rang. I stepped outside to the back porch for privacy. After brief greetings, Chairman Custalow cut to the chase. In deep, slow, Virginia drawl, "We had a meeting... and, there was some opposition... it was from the 'senior' folks. It had nothing to do with you and Cindy. The Pastor is very depressed. I'm sorry." Click.

The look on my face when I went back inside must've said it all. We hugged. It was an unexpected hijacking; a roadside bombing; a kick in the gut. Was it about us? Was it about God? Something was not right. Yes, "Some had cautioned."

It was a good lesson. We were entering a steep learning curve. Churches are erratic; people are fickle. They do irrational things, often for veiled reasons which have nothing to do with a "present issue." My journey with God's book was teaching me that (even well-meaning and precious) people – those who most ardently quote Scriptures – often violate its deepest principles in the name of "truth." Unable to regulate their lives from within, they cling to external governance in the form of black and white words on paper.

In this case, "those against" were working overtime and "secretly" (a biblical no-no) to undermine the church's decision (a previous meeting) to call an Associate Pastor. In time, we would learn that those same folks were perpetually in conflict with the Pastor (and previous pastors) over just about everything. Whatever the Pastor was "for," they would oppose... trimming the hedges, what songs to sing, or how hot or cool to keep the office. In this case, since the Pastor was in favor of calling an Associate, the opposing group began a *secret* campaign to control the business meeting.

Of course, Cindy and I were green as gourds, but we *would* toughen. Yes. In 23 years, we've seen the movie a few times. We were learning that without thick skin and a deep commitment to Jesus Christ, you won't last. Tragically, we've seen more than a few really GREAT God-called women and men buckle under the load of raw church politics – often disguised as "God's will." We held our heads high, trusted God and kept faith alive. We also found wonderful friends standing by our side.

*(You won't believe what's coming next.)*

Several weeks later, we got another call from the same Chair with an update: "The 'young people' have gotten together and called their own business meeting. They *reversed* the decision." He continued, "Would you forgive us and pray about coming to our church?" An old saying comes to mind: "Well. Bust my britches!" Let's see... hmmm...

how would young, energetic, and very naïve people with little ones still in the nest respond? I liken it to the cheerful boy who was handed a pitchfork and told to clean the barn: "*Yahoo! There's gotta be a pony in here somewhere!*" As Tutu said, "We were prisoners of HOPE!"

After arriving at Fairmount in July 1988, it wouldn't take long to put names, faces and stories together. We got the picture in short time. Even so, we rolled up our sleeves and moved beyond hidden agendas and church secrets. God's call was echoing. "Who will work in my field today?" "Here am I, Lord. Send me!"

Many years later, in conversation with a notable Baptist sage, the late Dr. Cecil Sherman, I remarked: "I guess you never stop being surprised by the things which church people do." It was part proposition and part question. His reply, "Well, as you get older, surprises happen less often." – Sherman's way of saying that churches are predictably erratic. Decisions often relate more to fear than faith; politics get "spiritualized;" and God's mission gets marginalized.

We moved into the church parsonage with a salary/benefits package of \$22,000. What would we do with all that money? I hit the ground running. Each day I worked as though the rapture would happen at noon. God's shining light in my life has always helped me find perspective. One morning as I readied for the office, Cindy squared my shoulders and looked me in the eye: "Are you enjoying the fruits of our hard work of preparation?" I hadn't even taken time to appreciate how happy I was, which, I think, was making her happy too! Thank God for grace and for a wonderful woman on this earth!

Yes, we learned to love the mix of saints/sinners that formed the people called Fairmount. It was a good beginning. There were many wonderful humans in that church - Jane Adams, "Alice," Dr. Curry and Debbie, a precious couple – Joe and Margaret Tate, the Penningtons, and Reveres. So many friends like Lanier and Margaret Riddell who've gone to be with Jesus! We were living God's dream! And, I was also learning what it means to be a VIRGINIA BAPTIST!

In just over two years, God's call would "bust our britches again!" We'd be moving to Chesterfield for close to eight years of trial and triumph! But, in next HH, I need first to talk about "The Science of Soul-Winning."

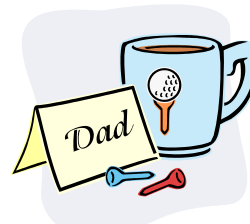
