COVID Vaccine Update

On April 26th, Richmond and Henrico residents will be able to directly schedule a COVID-19 vaccine appointment for Richmond and Henrico Health District events **without pre-registering**. All residents who are interested in receiving the COVID-19 vaccine, no matter what Phase they are in, will now have two, simple options to schedule an appointment:

Visit <u>vax.rchd.com</u> to directly schedule an appointment at one of our local vaccination events, or - Schedule an appointment over the phone by calling us at (804) 205-3501, Monday through Friday, 8am-5pm.

These options will make it easier for everyone to set up appointments and get access to the COVID-19 vaccine. Please spread



the word to your friends and family—as a reminder, everyone aged 16 and older is eligible for vaccination! Additionally, residents can visit <u>VaccineFinder.org</u> to find most of the places that offer vaccines in their area. Individuals without internet or phone access can get assistance inside Henrico and Richmond Public Libraries through utilizing their free internet access and on-site librarian support.

Since RHHD has contacted nearly every resident who filled out a pre-registration form, we felt comfortable making the exciting move to this easier registration system. Our scheduling team will continue to monitor the state's pre-registration system at <u>vaccinate.virginia.gov</u> and offer appointments to any remaining pre-registered individuals.

Scholarship Opportunity at University of Richmond for Members of Hatcher Memorial Baptist Church

We have been notified by the University of Richmond that we are invited to nominate a student attending the University for the Hatcher Memorial Baptist Church Scholarship. This scholarship is for the upcoming academic year. The nomination must be received by the University by May 1, 2021

This scholarship was established in the 1940's in the name of Hatcher Memorial Baptist Church. Any Hatcher member enrolled full-time at the University of Richmond is eligible to apply. Eligible enrollment is an Undergraduate – Arts & Sciences, E.C. Robins School of Business, or Jepson School of Leadership Studies.
