#### The Lamb's Basket Updates

At the close of business on December 31, 2021, LAMB's Basket completed nearly 10 years at its current location. 2021 was a difficult year for everyone due to COVID and all its variants. All of us have had to deal with the COVID pandemic in one way or the other. LB is no exception.

During 2020 the pantry was closed few months as a safeguard for our volunteers as well as our clients which continue a to impact our operating procedures during 2021. When we finally opened, operations were drastically different. Clients are currently not allowed inside the Pantry. Even while waiting outside, they continue to smile and are grateful for our being here for them. LB is now only open on Tuesdays and Thursdays and from 10:00 a.m. to noon for clients as well as deliveries. We also lost most of our retail partners. Trader Joe's, by far our largest and most generous do-nor for many years, was given to other pantries while we were closed and we will not be getting them back. Thankfully, we continue to receive donations from our community donors: our church sponsors, corporate partners, Cross Ridge, and many other private donations and food drives. We are most grateful for our supporters. Without them LAMB's Basket would not be in a position to continue to operate. Since reopening, we have been assigned Aldi's, Costco, Lidl, the Fresh Market, and Dollar General (which is scheduled to begin within the next few months). James Fussell schedules drivers for retail pickups. If you would like to help out contact the pantry.

At this time we are not allowing any outside groups to volunteer at the pantry due to COVID. When things calm down we will once again allow groups and our youth volunteers to return.

Clients have not returned to the Pantry as quickly as we expected. Where it was not unusual to have over 50 clients on any given distribution day, we now only see close to 30 and most days many fewer. We are accepting new clients but not performing the face-to-face interviews at this time. Clients are now allowed three visits per month.

The Pantry suffered a great loss this past year with the passing of Nancy Yeary. Nancy was a volunteer and board member for many years and a mainstay of our warehousing and distribution operations. Everyone remembers the Tomato Sandwich Fundraisers! We are considering doing one in 2022 in memory and in honor of her service. Judy Pierce and Ruby Foster along with all of their helpers are holding down the warehouse well. While no one can replace Nancy, these two volunteers are doing a fabulous job attending to stocking, product rotation, and distribution. We are grateful for the job they are doing.

Ann Decker continues to keep track of the number of clients served even if she is not at the Pantry. She is working from home and keeping us well informed of our statistics as well as handling the monthly reporting with Feed More. Thanks, Ann, for continuing with this phase of the operations.

Our newsletter, *The Woolly News*, continues to be distributed due to the creative efforts of Brenda Martin who also maintains the church volunteer schedule. We continue to distribute the newsletter electronically to reach the maximum number of readers.

During the year I had major surgery Thanks to Tom Morris for handling the weekly reporting to Feed More. Everything continued to run smoothly.

Intake computer operators primarily, Tom Morris, Bev Fletcher, Linda Patterson, and Tom Bosserman, have continued to keep the front office working well. We would not be able to handle the clients if it weren't for these dedicated volunteers.

The Board of Directors continues to meet monthly at the Pantry providing general oversight and direction to operations. We've lost a few members this year, so if anyone is interested in joining our board, please contact me at the pantry. Our financial position is good. Record keeping is a vital function in an organization as large as LB. Thanks to Beverley Fletcher and her financial expertise, our financial resources are tracked and safeguarded with care. Audits are conducted yearly by an outside accountant.

Working with LAMB's Basket has given each of us a more in-depth view of poverty in our community. I seldom hear a volunteer say that he or she does not enjoy working at the pantry, even if it includes carrying bags of food to cars in hot, cold or rainy weather or greeting a client at the door to bring them their food. Each of us has a job to do and few days go by without seeing smiles and a sense of accomplishment on the faces of those who serve and are being served. May we be blessed with the ability to continue as stewards of these gifts as we serve our community.

#### NEW COVID GUIDELINES


In 2021, we as a church family have weathered the Covid issues so well because we made all decisions with prayer, discussions, evaluations, and mutual respect for everyone's health needs and concerns. Presently, our Commonwealth is facing a renewed Covid wave of health issues causing much concern in our communities and our churches. Several churches in our community have made a temporary decision to curtail "in person worship", Bible Studies, fellowships, and general meetings. As your pastor, I am asking you and our leadership to once again consider with me the best and immediate safety options for Hatcher's Church Family. Since our worship sanctuary is so large and we are already familiar with the safety protocols in place, please consider these options for the immediate future until March 1, 2022:

- Postponing "in person" Wednesday Evening Meals/ Bible Study until March 2.
- Please be sensitive to again wearing our Masks
- Please be sensitive to safe distancing once again
- We are not roping every other pew at this time, but asking sensitivity to spacing
- Use of the hand sanitizer Hatcher provides
- We are once again asking our Deacons to monitor the ingress and egress.

Please note this is also causing our Ministry Partners to address these same concerns as some of our teachers in the CDC and students have tested positive and McShin is having to develop some protocols for some of their homes. We are asking everyone to be supportive of this new process as these new considerations will need to be evaluated by our Sunday School Leadership, Alice Phillips, and our Music Leadership, Warren Mitchell. Our Deacons and Church Council will be asked to offer leadership and evaluations. Please remember our church leaders in your prayers as Hatcher is considering how it can make the most positive and healthy decisions for the

#### **Benevolence Updates**

Since 2015 we have partnered with Henrico Social Services HEARTH program (Henrico Emergency Assistance) to provide financial assistance to Henrico residents. When benevolence requests were received, many times a referral was made to them for assistance instead if we felt they could be of more assistance.

As of December 31, 2021, then HEARTH program is no longer in service due to lack of funding. Therefore, all benevolence requests are processed in house.

For the year 2021, we received over a hundred requests, many of them due to the impacts of Covid-19. Because of that, we extended our service area beyond Henrico County and also made some exceptions as to the type of assistance provided if vetting proved authentic and was approved by the Deacon Board,

Going forward we plan to revise our process of vetting (verifying) information by meeting with an area church with whom we have established a relationship via the vetting process. Hopefully, we can use their process as a model for revamping ours, which will include having additional members on the benevolence committee, which in turn would allow us to process many more requests.

Hatcher Church is a very giving and supportive church; and my hope is that this message will reinforce your confidence in us as good stewards of your monies and also to allow you to experience the great spiritual reward of being the hands and feet of Jesus.
