Look What God Is Doing

God has used HMBC to make fourteen food boxes for those who identifies as food insecure for **Thanksgiving**. These Thanksgiving boxes went to fourteen families feeding over seventy individuals. What a Blessing for all. Those who gave, those who worked, and those who received. Five of HMBC newest members have said, "I want to be more attached to the church family. How can I serve here at church?" **The Mailbox Ministry Team** is beginning to form where the team will mail cards to visitors, new members, sick, shut-ins, birthdays, and anniversaries. Yes, there are groups sending cards often and this will be an added mail out. This team will not take the place of what is happening it will just enhance the love of God others mailed out.

Preparing for the **Christmas Boxes** for those who are food insecure. Remember, we do a box for each McShin House. There are fifteen houses but one has twenty participants in the house so we will fill two specific boxes for that house. Also. we will be helping individuals and families who are food insecure **who did not receive help** at Thanksgiving. The deacon co-chairs are receiving names already of those in need for Christmas boxes. If you can bring groceries (nonperishables) and place in the boxes in the elevator hallway. The Deacons are not calling to ask if anyone needs a basket of food, we are receiving names unsolicited.

Did you see as the children left the sanctuary Sunday
Morning the number of kids that were involved? Let us
keep the prayers going as we see the Children's
Ministry growing. The first three Friday evenings and
first three Saturday mornings are set aside for families
to bring their children to watched while parents do
parent stuff. I am excited to be one of the seed planters
in the hearts of these dear ones.

Look What God is doing at HMBC. I am grateful for all the blessings God brings our way. No negative Nancy's here if there is one or fifty children, we will plant seeds for Christ. We will be His hands, feet, arms, ears, and mouthpiece to share His Love. Thank You Heather Stamey for leading out in this ministry. There is room for all willing to serve. Serve through praying for the kids who want to come, for the families who need a little time to do parent things. Roll up your sleeves and serve popcorn and drink, sit near a child during a movie or cook a plain hotdog with ketchup. Be a blessing giving a dollar or two to buy crafts supplies or food.


Pastor Sharpe will do another meeting after January 1st, stay tuned for the details in the coming weeks!
