Wednesday Night Suppers

This will be a pilot project for February, March, and April 2023.

Starting February 1st at 5:00 pm our McShin friends will begin dinner. Our McShin friends have to eat dinner and be back in class at 6:00 pm. Serving them first will give them enough time to eat, have some time for fellowship, and get to class without being tardy. The fellowship hall will be set up for McShin and set up for Hatcher church family. This allows clean up to happen in one area while a group eats in the other area.

Trying this pilot project will meet the needs of McShin getting to their classes on time, allowing those church members who can not get to the church until 6 or after time to get here, ensure the choir members have time for Bible study and dinner before choir at 7:00pm and allows those in the congregation to have options of eating early at 5 and getting back home before dark. This is just to a pilot project, if this does not seem to work out we will try other options.

The Wednesday night suppers for the church family will begin Ash Wednesday February 22nd at 5:30 pm prior to the Ash Wednesday service in the sanctuary. The church family meals will be at 6:00 pm on Wednesday evenings following Ash Wednesday.

The menu for February is as follows:

February 1 st	Fried Chicken (2 piece meal), green beans, mashed potatoes, dessert and beverage
February 8 th	Sliced Ham, lima Beans, mac n cheese, applesauce, dessert and beverage
February 15 th	Bake Potato Bar and Chili, various toppings (Sweet Potatoes) and toppings, dessert and beverage
February 22 nd	BBQ sandwich, baked beans, coleslaw, chips, dessert and beverage

Costs for all meals is \$10.00
