Sharpe Insight. In recent conversations with our Deacons, Church Council, leaders, and members of Hatcher, it has been most interesting to dialogue concerning our understanding of worship and what helps one to feel most comfortable when participating in a

worship service. So everyone will understand about worship styles, music, and worship expectations, it is my purpose to explain a brief general format of the three basic forms of worship in today's spiritual culture, they are: Liturgical, Traditional, and Contemporary.

In general, **Liturgical Church** worship **involves the use of prescribed lectionary readings and liturgy.** Scripture holds a high place in liturgical churches, often with all four passages read from the lectionary. Clergy, as well as other functionaries in the worship service, often wear robes, stoles, and other vestments. In looking at the different services, every tradition, even non-liturgical worship will have their repeated worship elements that no Sunday service would or could do without. So every church actually has a form or liturgy for organized and good orderly worship.

Traditional Churches are more formal than contemporary congregations, yet less formal than liturgical ones. They represent a mid-ground in many ways. Traditional churches prefer less elaborate sanctuaries. Clergy and laity typically dress up for church, but ministers only wear robes for special occasions; traditional worship has brief scripture readings with music selected from a hymnal. The music is usually directed by a Minister of Music directing the congregation and a choir with the primary musical instruments being the piano and organ.

Contemporary Churches use a relaxed worship format compared to the other styles by using praise songs and choruses. This "come as you are" relaxed worship style, surprisingly, came out of the Liturgical and Traditional styles of worship for those desiring something different. A praise band usually leads the music using drums, guitars, and varied instruments with about 20-23 minutes of group singing and often concluding with a solo or a testimony of one's personal faith. The message is often 30-45 minutes. Contemporary churches are often new Church Starts and located in store front settings, old businesses, and often movie theaters.

The reason I am sharing this profile in worship with you, is that in evaluating all three worship styles there are three questions that come to mind, "Do all three worship styles attempt to worship, praise, and honor Jesus as God's one and only Son as the savior of the world?" And my answer is a Big YES! My second question is, "Are all three attempting to honor Jesus by sharing his redemptive love to a lost world?" And my answer is a Big YES! The final question is "Has God decided not to bless any of three Church Styles because of their style of worship?" And my answer is a Big NO!

God is blessing all three! Here is the memo to everyone: in reading John's Book of the Revelation, **in Heaven, God uses all three styles**...we better get use to it. The other two style may not be our "Cup of Tea" on Earth but when we get to Heaven life is going to be interesting and exciting!

May the blessings of Jesus be yours, Pastor Sharpe

The average worship service tithing/offering per week was \$2,735.26. They had 3 worship services to accommodate their growing numbers. One at 9:30am, 11:00am, and 8:00 pm.

Hearts In Motion

Per newsletter from River City Faith Network: Church Hill Christian Wellness Center is collecting filled backpacks and toiletry bags this summer. Hatcher is included on the list of churches for this particular center. The deadline for collection will be Sunday, Aug. 13th so that we can pack everything for delivery on Aug. 17th or 18th. (My Boston family will be staying with us Aug. 12th – 19th so I will need some help.)

They need these 11 items for toiletry bags: Shampoo, Comb & Brush, Deodorant, Soap, Washcloth, Toothbrush, Toothpaste, Mouthwash, Floss, and Lotion.

Backpacks should include: 1 three-ring binder and divider tabs, 1 or 2 packs of loose-leaf paper (wide or standard rule), 4 black-and-white composition books, 2 One-subject spiral notebooks, 1 Three- or five-subject spiral notebooks, pack of No. 2 pencils (not mechanical), pack of Black or blue ink pens (no gel), Pocket folders (with or without brads) in solid colors, pack of red pens, Elmer's glue-4 oz. and/or glue sticks.

I have noticed some stores already advertising school supplies for sale. If we divide and conquer, I think we should be able to supply 10 filled backpacks and 10 toiletry bags.
